PRESIDENT: Senator Chizek, please.

SENATOR CHIZEK: Senator Conway wanted to know how many games I took, 24 and 1, Senator. This resolution is honoring the Millard South girls basketball team who had an outstanding record and are the reigning girls championship basketball Class A team, and I urge your support of the resolution.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. The question is the adoption of the resolution. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 24 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of LR 49.

PRESIDENT: LR 49 is adopted. We'll move on to motion by Senator Elmer.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Elmer would move to withdraw LB 609. Senator Elmer offered his motion yesterday. It's found on page 1117 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: Senator Elmer, please.

SENATOR ELMER: Thank you, Mr. President and members. LB 609 was a bill that would have allowed NRD's to not publish a ballot with a write-in space in a primary election, if there were no other candidates, to save money and such as that. However, during the hearings with the Government Committee it was found that another bill contains the same provisions and is included in their study, and to go ahead and hear another bill of identical context, a week from tomorrow in the Government Committee, would be superfluous. There is no longer any need for the bill, so I'd ask your unanimous consent to withdraw LB 609.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Baack, please.

SENATOR BAACK: Yes, Mr. President, members. I would just urge you to let him withdraw this bill because the Government Committee is in the process, right now, of doing an election law study, and this is part of our study. And we also do have
