brief comment on the study portion of the amendment. inception of the bill at least from the beginning, I have always thought that we need to go ahead and carry on a study on ... at the same time of what is happening. Senator Schellpeper had an amendment that was already adopted that had the Education Committee that will be going throughout the state looking at all aspects and all the areas as the thing is slowly being phased in. I also wanted a second contingency to calm to alleviate the concerns that we're moving too fast without any status, statistics, excuse me, or information and have the Department of Education further study as it is being implemented slowly, the effects of how many students did opt out, want to opt out, what reasons were stated, how many students were accepted, how many were rejected, what was the reason for the objection, how did the money go, was there any problems with the funding that we have at this particular point or as it maybe changed? All those things will be looked at on a yearly basis and reported back to the Education Committee and this Legislature so we can have a clear, concise idea of what is happening as it is being implemented, and I think that will give us the hard data that we will need to carry on wise policies, changes updated, updates that we may need to do. Thank you, Mr. President.
