CLERK: 23 ayes, 2 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The house is now under call. Members please return to your seats and record your presence. Those members outside the Legislative Chamber, please return and record your presence. Senator Moore, please. Members, please return to your seats and record your presence. Those outside the Chamber, please return. Senators Landis, Lynch, Labedz, the house is under call. Senator Rod Johnson, the house is under call. Senators Lynch and Labedz, the house is under call. Did you request a roll call vote?

SENATOR HEFNER: Yes, please, roll call vote.
