

district shall give first priority for enrollment to option students whose request for enrollment would aid the racial integration of the option school district and the resident school district. For purposes of this section, racial integration is aided if a student transfers to an option school district in which his or her race is a smaller percentage of the total student enrollment of the option school district than it is of the student's resident school district." That is the amendment that I discussed earlier, except that we have excised out all language with reference to transportation costs being paid. And Senator Baack is going to have an amendment that makes that question subject to a study. So I'm asking that you adopt this amendment that I've just read to you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Any discussion on the Chambers amendment? Seeing none, the question is the adoption of the Chambers amendment. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Please record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Chambers' amendment.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The amendment is adopted. Next item.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Baack would move to amend. (Read Baack amendment as found on pages 1164-65 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR BAACK: Correct.

SPEAKER BARRETT: (Gavel.) Senator Baack, please.

SENATOR BAACK: Yes, Mr. Speaker and members. This is another short amendment, I think Senator Chambers referred to it. In the bill Senator Schellpeper amended the bill back on General File and that amendment was that the Education Committee would do a study. This study...this puts into the study also that we will study the transportation based on the need of students, to make sure that transportation...that all students would have the accessibility to choice, if they needed to, and they wouldn't be precluded because they couldn't afford transportation. I think that was one of Senator Lamb's points, because he said this might be too elitist. This deals with that point. We are going to discuss that. Both Iowa and Minnesota are looking at this also. And it also puts into the study a...it says "and whether
