SENATOR LYNCH: We will have it for you in one minute.

PRESIDENT: All right, be at ease for a moment. Senator Lynch, the Clerk suggests that perhaps we had better vote on your amendment, and then we can take an amendment following it up deleting the portion you wish to have deleted.

SENATOR LYNCH: Mr. President, as I stated before, I think it would be a cleaner way to do that. I just wanted to clarify the fact that I would not expect the body's support of this amendment now under consideration without favorable consideration of the other one.

PRESIDENT: Yeah.

SENATOR LYNCH: I would ask for a close, if there are no other lights on on this amendment.

PRESIDENT: That is correct. Would you like to close?

SENATOR LYNCH: No, I would waive closing and ask for your support for this original amendment.

PRESIDENT: All right. The question is the adoption of the Lynch amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.
