ASSISTANT CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 mays to cease debate, Mr. President,

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Ashford, would you like to close on your amendment to the amendment?

SENATOR ASHFORD: Thank you, Mr. President. I'm sorry the amendment apparently has not been passed out but to go over it again, the amendment to the Moore amendment would mandate that of the \$20 million appropriated in the Moore amendment 80 percent of that would be directed to teachers' salaries. And as Senator Moore has suggested, I think the formula needs to be worked on and possibly the numbers need to be worked on but it may give us a base of...that we can act on on this bill and maintain the intent of LB 89, have the money go to teachers' salaries or a substantial portion of it go to teachers' salaries pursuant to a formula that's agreed to by this body and go from there. So I would move the amendment to the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. The question is the adoption of the Ashford amendment to the Moore amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Simple majority. Have you all voted? Have you all voted?

SENATOR ASHFORD: I would like to ask for a call of the house.

PRESIDENT: Okay. The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 2 mays to go under call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The house is under call. Please record your presence and those not in the Chamber, please return to the Chamber so that we may proceed. Unauthorized personnel, please leave the floor. Sonator Conway, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR CONWAY: A point of personal privilege.

PRESIDENT: Pardon me?

SENATOR CONWAY: Point of personal privilege.

PRESIDENT: State your point.
