PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Moore was closing and the question is the adoption of the Moore amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay.

SENATOR MOORE: (Microphone not on) \dots (inaudible) losing votes, so I just say that.

PRESIDENT: Okay, the question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 17 ayes, 3 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. The house is under call. Please record your presence. Those not in the Chamber, please return and record your presence. Look up to see if your light is lit. Senator Weihing, Senator Robak. Senator Lamb, please. Senator Conway, please. Thank you. Senator Landis, Senator Wesely, Senator Labedz, Senator McFarland. We're looking for Senator Langford and Senator...or no, Senator Landis and Senator Labedz. Now we're looking for Senator Landis. We're going to have a roll call vote and the question is the adoption of the Moore amendment. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote read. See page 1297 of the Legislative Journal.) 14 ayes, 28 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The amendment fails. Anything else on it, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Chambers, you had printed an amendment earlier to a pending amendment, Senator. I just simply need to show it withdrawn. Okay. I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Okay, we're back on the advancement of the bill. The call is raised. Senator Lynch, do you want to speak about your bill?

SENATOR LYNCH: In fact, Mr. President and members, I would be willing to close unless there are any other lights on right now.

PRESIDENT: There are several.
