the Historical Society, these are the three I want, and I know you are not going to like them, these are the three and these are the only three. And the Historical Society says, you are right, we don't like them. Now, where do we go? Where do we go if we can't find that mutually...mutual agreed third party? I think in this particular case, under normal circumstances, think what you are trying to suggest is valid, in this particular case, I don't think that is going to be possible.

SENATOR GOODRICH: With the exception that, for example, the Indian Commission, let's say the Indian group will say that it does not ... that it wants to be hard-nosed about this, and they know they aren't going to get a thing back until they have an agreeable member as a third member on that, so, consequently, they have to be reasonable, at least, ...

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Yeah, and that gets to the heart of why I guess I am against this. We take what you said, Senator, and I know you have all the good intentions, but in my feeling is you are saying, in essence, we are saying, listen, if we tell the Pawnee that, listen, unless you give us one that we can agree upon, we are not going to get a party of three or a committee of three and, therefore, you are not going to get anything back, what we are saying is that you have to, in essence, agree to somebody that we want, because if we don't agree with what you want, there will be no committee, you will get nothing back, there will be no claim, therefore, you must compromise and you must go with what we want. And that is the attitude that we have had that has bogged this thing down and brought this bill, technically, to where we are today. I might also point out that the other problem I have with the committee structure as you have, and if I take too much time, I will give you some of my time...

SENATOR GOODRICH: That's all right.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: ...that I will have coming, the other problem I have ...

SENATOR LABEDZ: One minute, Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: What did you say?

SENATOR LABEDZ: One minute.
