

SENATOR CONWAY: ...believes that the Historical Society has things in their possession. The Historical Society, after the request and 90 days prior to the agreed upon date of when one would hand over those particular items, would give a complete inventory of what those items are that are going to be...that they will be handing over at the date that they are to hand them over, and it gives the tribe an opportunity to go over that list and get some verification of knowledge, or at least knowledge of what it is they are going to be receiving at the point that they do receive these items.

SENATOR WARNER: So let's get away from the Historical Society. A museum...

SENATOR CONWAY: Any, any...

SENATOR WARNER: ...would...

SENATOR CONWAY: Any entity that is holding the goods, currently, that is being challenged, 90 days prior to turning over the goods in question, gives a list of what those goods will be.

SENATOR WARNER: So initially the museum or the entity would make a determination...

SENATOR CONWAY: Correct.

SENATOR WARNER: ...as to what the items are that they believe are to be returned.

SENATOR CONWAY: Under the description of LB 340, of what burial goods and skeletal remains should go back under this bill when requested, the holding entity, the museum, the Historical Society, whoever that may be, then prepares that list. They have all the documentation, you know, they are the ones with the documentation. They take that documentation and establish...

SENATOR WARNER: Then I assume that then there is...is this documentation of all goods that are held, or just the items they believe...

SENATOR CONWAY: Just those items that they believe they will need to turn over at the end of the 90 days under the
