SENATOR CONWAY: I don't believe it would because that would kick in after the fact of the transmittal date. If there was a disagreement at the transmittal date, prior to this it's simply information sharing ahead of time.

SENATOR WARNER: Thank you.

SENATOR LANDIS: Senator Warner, yours was the last light. With that, we'll proceed to the closing on this amendment. Senator Conway.

SENATOR CONWAY: Mr. President, members, all this really amounts to, two parts, the first one is that to help facilitate the process to get information flowing back and forth between the receiving and the entity or the institutions holding the goods, to get that information ahead of time Senator Warner suggested we put it down in farmers terms. It may be that I bought a bin of shelled corn from Senator Warner, I have no idea exactly how many bushels there may be, and I would like him to give me an accounting prior to my sending the truck, so I'll know how many bushels are going to be there that I'm going to be receiving. It's an advanced information of what it is that we think we are holding. The second part simply then also puts into the statute that a bit of protection, a bill of sale, if you will, that here is the inventory that we agreed to, yes, I did receive the items that were on that list as per the way they were marked by the experts that mark these items when they were originally dug up. So it's a verification that both sides agree that there is this burial good identified by such and such a number, and yes I did receive that and I'm signing off and now I have received that particular item, whatever that item was. So that's really all this does, it just helps clarify some of the procedural activity that will go on in this process.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Senator Conway. Let's proceed back to our desks, get ready to vote on the Conway amendment. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. I encourage you to return to your chairs and vote. Seems to be a languid Thursday afternoon. Let's be about our business. Senator Conway, since the Chair is of a mind to call the vote,...
