CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Goodrich would move to amend. Senator, I have your amendment found on page 1167 of the Journal.

SENATOR LANDIS: Senator Goodrich, to open on his amendment. Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Mr. President, members of the body, I would like to divide the question on my own amendment, since we have done considerable with this bill since I submitted the amendment. I would like to commence in my amendment, commence with line 19 on the second page...

SENATOR LANDIS: Senator Goodrich asks if the question can be divided.

SENATOR GOODRICH: ...from that point on is all I want to take up.

SENATOR LANDIS: The Chair believes this to be a dividable issue. Does the Chair hear objection from the floor? The question is divided.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Thank you.

SENATOR LANDIS: Page 2, line 19, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Senator Chambers, we're just talking about from that point on in my amendment. The first one, for example, deals with...

SENATOR LANDIS: Pardon me, Senator Goodrich, you'll need to move...are you asking to withdraw the first portion that you've divided?

SENATOR GOODRICH: I can, yes.

SENATOR LANDIS: The Section 10 language, can we do that.

SENATOR GOODRICH: I'd be glad to withdraw the first part of the amendment that we have not...we're not taking up.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you. Senator Goodrich asks...requests to withdraw the divided Section 1, is there objection? It is so
