

handled. Senator Goodrich now proceeds on to line 19, page 2 and the remainder of the amendment. Senator Goodrich, to open.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Okay, now if anybody wants to follow this particular...these amendments rather, just refer to the amendment 5080 in your bill book, and that is what we're working off of. That is not the green copy, it's just 5080 section of the bill or form of the bill rather. Bottom of page 1, line 21, the words "equal and", in other words I'm saying my motion says strike those two words, the reason being the existing law on cemeteries reflects the value society places on preserving human burial sites, but does not clearly provide equal and adequate protection. I'm saying let's strike "equal and", it doesn't change the meaning one iota, it just says that...just avoids rather us admitting in statute somewhere that we have been unequal in subjecting ourselves to lawsuits in the future based on that. Number...the second one, for example, deals with page 3, line 9, and it says "unless such sites are in reasonable danger of destruction, such sites need to be removed for highway, road, street construction projects", et cetera. Well there are other types of public projects such as a dam or a public park or a...oh heck, there's a myriad of public entities. I'm just suggesting that we put in that position, in that spot rather we add "or other public projects". So if there is another public project, we're not limiting ourselves just to the roads. Okay. Now let's go to page 3 and let's skip the five and six for a second. Let's go to seven, which says in essence on page 9, I'm going to come back to five and six in a minute here, on page 9 we have the...It's the construction equipment, where if somebody accidentally uncovers a...the remains of a grave that they shall forfeit the construction equipment as well. Try to find where the darn thing is. Here it is. Okay. Page 9, excuse me, page 9, line 3, start there. Including the forfeiture of any human skeletal remains or burial goods acquired, or equipment used in the violation. Well, in other words, if somebody is running a highway project and uncovers a burial site with a turnpole, for example, or a combination of CAT and turnpole, he doesn't automatically forfeit the construction equipment. Now, going back to number 8 is just renumber the appropriate sections, if there are any. We can drop that, it doesn't pertain anymore. Five and six of this particular amendment do nothing but set a three year time in which the remains can be returned, but Senator Warner's coming up with an amendment on that, so I'm going to suggest also that we do another split, we just drop five and six out of it until
