

Senator Warner's amendment comes up, which I like better than my own. So I would move that we split out...divide the question again and put out...take five and six out of the act...out of the amendments rather.

SENATOR LANDIS: Senator Goodrich, so that the Chair is absolutely clear, you're asking for whether or not subsection 5 and 6, appearing on page 3 of your amendment can be divided and treated as one issue, leaving subsection 7, 8, 2, 3, and 4 as one entity...

SENATOR GOODRICH: Yes, let's take 5, 6 and 8, because there is no need for the renumbering of sections. So we just divide out 5, 6 and 8 and leave the rest of them in.

SENATOR LANDIS: Senator Chambers...or Senator Goodrich asks if the Chair will divide the question. Before the Chair decides that issue, is there objection from the floor? The Chair concludes that this is a divisible question, and will divide the issue. Senator Goodrich, let me ask you as to your intent, you want us to take up 2, 3, 4 and 7 at one time, is that the issue that you now want before us?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Two, three, four and seven, exactly, that's all we're taking up.

SENATOR LANDIS: Are you asking that 5, 6 and 8 be withdrawn?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Be perfectly happy to.

SENATOR LANDIS: Is there an objection from the floor? They are withdrawn. We are now discussing the Goodrich amendment which consists of subsections 2, 3, 4 and 7 on pages 2 and 3 of the printed amendment. Continue, Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Okay, getting back to the four items then, one of which is the...dropping the words "equal and" on the front page there, which is just nothing but avoids any lawsuits. Number...the second one rather is the "or other project", "other public projects", excuse me, and oh, one more thing, on number 4 on page 2, I forgot the...I overlooked the explanation of that one, on page 6, line 8, let's go back a little bit so we can pick up the thought. It's "reburial shall be in accordance with the wishes and at the expense of any known relatives in the order listed in Section 71-1339, or if no relatives are known"
