

the one bringing the action wins it means that the person accused of having violated this act was found by the court to have intentionally violated it, the equipment is not confiscated prior to any action by the court. The court is not mandated as far as a confiscation is concerned. What the language says is that when a person has been found to have intentionally violated this act, among the things that a court can require is the confiscation or forfeiture of this equipment. So nothing happens while it's an allegation, nothing happens if the person is acquitted, only if they are found by a court to have intentionally violated this act do they lose that equipment, if the court so decrees. So I'm asking that you adopt this amendment so that we leave that language in the bill allowing the forfeiture of the equipment of one found by a court to have intentionally violated this act.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Senator Chambers. That being your closing, we'll move to a voting. Please return to your chairs, prepare to vote on the Chambers amendment to the Goodrich amendment. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'd like a call of the house.

SENATOR LANDIS: Senator Chambers has requested a call of the house. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Clerk will record.

Senator Johnson's, one and all. Senator Lamb, please. Senators Chizek and Scofield. Senator Warner, check in, please. Senators Ashford, Hartnett and McFarland. Senator Chambers, should we proceed?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Clerk, call the roll please on the Chambers amendment to the Goodrich amendment.
