I recognize the scientific desire and need to examine before returning these items. Three years was what was asked for. Three years is what this original amendment calls for. I'm suggesting we cut that in half, as a compromise, down to a year and a half and I'd ask your support for that amendment.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. You've heard the closing and the question is the adoption of the Wesely amendment to the Wesely amendment. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Twenty-five votes necessary. Have you all voted? Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, I'd ask for a call of the house.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Clear the board, Mr. Clerk. The question is, shall the house go under call? Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 1 nay.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The house is under call, motion prevails. Members, please return to your seats and record your presence. We have a request for a roll call vote in regular order. Senator Hefner, the house is under call. Senator Hall, please, the house is under call. Senator Labertz. Senator Bernard-Stevens, record your presence. Senator Robak, please, the house is under call. Members, please return to your seats for a roll call vote. The question is the adoption of the Wesely amendment to the second part of the Wesely amendment. Mr. Clerk, proceed with the roll call.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 1343-44 of the Legislative Journal.) 22 ayes, 20 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Motion fails. The call is raised. Senator Wesely, back to the second part of your divided question.

SENATOR WESELY: Yes, with the defeat of that amendment I'd ask for that to be withdrawn.

SPEAKER BARRETT: You are asking that it be withdrawn?

SENATOR WESELY: Yes.
