

SPEAKER BARRETT: It is withdrawn.

CLERK: Just that part, Senator?

SENATOR WESELY: Withdraw the whole amendment.

CLERK: The whole amendment? Okay.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Mr. Clerk, next item.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have to the bill is by Senator Warner. Senator, this is your amendment that reads, on page 8, Section 9, line 9, by adding "except such remains and goods, the disposition of which is disputed and subject to arbitration".

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: I think, Mr. President, that I would ask to pass over and take that later. This amendment is filed because the way the bill stands right now, there is a very short time frame and I... understanding there are other amendments pending, or at least I understood will be offered, that changes the procedure for the way in which any disputed items could be dealt with and this amendment is written to the way the bill as it stands now, which is this very short time frame. I want to be sure that if something was in the process of being determined, that it stayed where it is until that dispute was resolved, but since there are other amendments pending I would like to withdraw it and refile it in the line, if I may do that, in order to see what other changes are made. Now, if I can't do that, I'll do it later, but...

SPEAKER BARRETT: Well, in the opinion of the Chair, it can certainly be withdrawn, Senator Warner, and will go to the bottom of the pile. You can refile at some later point.

SENATOR WARNER: That I would do then depending on what happens on some of these other amendments.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. It is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk.
