SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: That one I will proceed with, Mr. Chairman, Mr. President. This amendment is intended to be fairly straightforward. The discussions which I have heard, or proponents make, seem to deal with the skeletal remains and burial goods and other artifacts that have records which are adequate to be able to make the interpretations that some feel can be done. It is my understanding from comments that were made on the floor that essentially those will be items that were disinterred after 1933. That's the only ones that really have records that are adequate to make the kind of determination that we have all been led to believe could be done. And this primarily is offered because my presumption is, and I can be corrected, but my presumption is, as the bill is currently drafted, it would go to every museum in the state, could conceivably have some portion of skeletal remains such as perhaps some mummies, or there could be other burial goods that are associated with a variety of areas and a variety of locations in the world that could conceivably be subject if someone wished to file a...the necessary process to reclaim those items. And this would further narrow to what we have basically been talking about which I believe is the Hill excavations or disinterments that occurred, as I understood it, '33, '34, 1933, '34 and '35, in that time frame, and this is...the reason for offering is to exclude items ahead of that time which in all probability there would not be the adequate detailed records as it has been presented at least that would identify items as required by the bill.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Discussion on the amendment offered by Senator Warner. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I'd like to ask Senator Warner a question.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Would you respond, Senator Warner.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Warner, the purpose of your amendment is to deal with human skeletal remains also, is it not?

SENATOR WARNER: I believe the way...where this amendment is located that would be accurate, Senator Chambers, yes.
