upon the institution who ought to provide to whomever requests that establish relative or tribe, but because of that it virtually means that their entire amount of material they have would have to be itemized and identified and I think we ought to stay with at least those areas that we have fairly good knowledge as to what is being affected.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. The question before the body is the adoption of the Warner amendment to LB 340. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Voting on the Warner amendment. you all voted? Have you all voted? Have you all voted if you'd care to vote? Record.

CLERK: 17 ayes, 15 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Motion fails. Next item.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have is by Senator Warner. Senator, this is your amendment that reads, on page 8, line 9, strike "1989" and insert "1990". (Warner amendment appears on page 1345 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, that amendment was discussed earlier. It extends by one year the time frame of, obviously, the way the bill is now, I don't think it would be feasible to be able to meet the first time frame for in any respects, both as to acquisition of a burial site or any conflicts that might arise from identification of artifacts or burial goods. would extend that period at least one year. I'm not real comfortable with that the way the bill now is, but certainly it would be more feasible to accomplish all the things that are outlined within the bill that needs to be followed procedurally and for that basis I will offer the amendment.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Discussion on the amendment. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, as I stated earlier, I support Senator Warner's amendment and I would hope that you would vote to adopt it.
