

amendment that was just adopted, the bottom of page 2 which allows decisions to be appealed, that under that process with an appropriate court filing, that goods could be...would remain where they are until the appeal process was completed. If there is a process that you have to go through to get the court to order it, that seems like unnecessary in that goods ought to remain where they are pending the appeal process till that is completed, it seems just reasonable, rather than force another court action to have those goods retained. If I am in error on the process of requiring a court order to have the goods remain where they are prior to the request, until the court proceeding is completed, well, I could stand to be corrected, but it seems to me that it's my understanding that is the case and it would seem that that would be unnecessary to force any museum to have to go through that process if things went so far as to be covered by this portion of the act.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Discussion on the amendment offered by Senator Warner. Senator Chambers.
