already will take place mainly that while the dispute is in progress, the burial goods and items under dispute will remain where they are at the time the dispute commenced.

SENATOR WARNER: That is correct. The reason I raised the concern is the appeal process is roughly, if it went its full course, adds up to 195 days and with the Conway amendment it would appear to me that there are only 90 days to...time frame between a time an entity had provided a list of their goods to whoever was making the request and when possession of the goods would exchange hands. Unless you got a court order to extend it seems unnecessary to have to go through that court process and unnecessary expense.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Based on what Senator Warner has explained, I have no problem with his amendment. I will want to be sure that we do put it in the proper place in the bill so that we inadvertently won't do something that none of us intend. We won't do anything other than what it is we all intend. support Senator Warner's amendment, in other words. Warner, I see what you feel like sometimes when you are explaining those revenue bills, I mean appropriation bills.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you Mr. President. I just want to state a couple of questions, I guess, and I don't know if I need to ask Senator Conway or not, but it is my understanding, Senator Conway, on your 90-day amendment we agreed to, the purpose of...would you just briefly respond to the purpose to which you offered that amendment, specifically the 90 days, that at the end of that period, what would be happening?

SENATOR CONWAY: The provision, Senator Bernard-Stevens, the 90 days was that he who holds, the institution who currently is in possession of the artifacts, the skeletal remains and/or the burial goods, once they have been challenged and requested for the return of those burial goods, 90 days prior to the date in which they would give those remains up must relinquish a list of inventory to identify to the receiving party what items they believe they will be giving up and the receiving party will receive at the point of transition.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Okay, so, in essence, it was just an itemized list, not necessarily saying that it needed to be
