

transferred within...if it hadn't been transferred within 90 days, it needed to be so. Correct?

SENATOR CONWAY: Correct. In their request, there would be a set date when they would expect this transmittal and 90 days prior to that the holding institution would describe what it is they are going to transmit at the end of that 90-day period.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Senator Conway. I guess, maybe it shows the frustration that I am beginning to grow and the cynicism that is beginning to envelope me on this particular bill, LB 340, with the two parties particularly involved. I am beginning to envision all sorts of possibilities. For example, 1,054 items that the Pawnee feel need to be returned, if none of those have to be returned before we go through an entire appeals process on each one, would that be a way that the Historical Society and/or anyone else would be able to maintain any item, dependent upon the resources of the Pawnee Tribe, or what have you, to go through all the court proceedings. I have somehow, deep within I have some type of feeling that I don't think there is anything wrong with the amendment. I think I am going to support the amendment, but I want to be...in fact, I'm not sure what I'm going to do now that I think about it, but I have a feeling that we want to be very careful that we don't set up a procedure that once we make a decision that none of the goods can go back even if there...even if they are in agreement too because of the lengthy court procedures. So I just kind of want to state those concerns on the record. Thank you Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Landis please.

SENATOR LANDIS: Waive off.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Any other discussion? Senator Warner, would you care to close? Thank you. The question is the adoption of the Warner amendment to LB 340. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, please.
