I think that when you can vote for every single member on the county board or the city council, then they are accountable for your vote, and they come up and ask for your support. As far as the excesses, campaign spending, I've heard Senator Chambers mentioned that many times before I don't even have anyone from south Omaha on the county board right now. But when I've got a problem I call all five of them. I certainly don't worry about just talking to one because I know the one would probably be responsible to the people in my district, but I want all five of them to be voting yes or no, depending on the proposal that is in front of them. So I urge you to adopt the amendment. It's a compromise, Senator Chambers, it's something you wanted for a long time, and this is a compromise. The county board opposes district elections. My time is up?

SPEAKER BARRETT: Your time is up.

SENATOR LABEDZ: I know you're smiling when you smile and you're saying my time is up. Thank you.
