

SENATOR WESELY: When we had...this bill deals with petitions and the financial disclosure information, I'm trying to think of other...have you looked at other disclosures? I'm trying to think now, out of state, does this cover out of state contributors as well as in state? Because...

SENATOR WITHEM: I believe...I believe what the amendment does is it references Sections 49-1459 through 1462 that applies the same reporting requirements that you have to file, that I have to file. If we get a check...

SENATOR WESELY: Oh...

SENATOR WITHEM: ...for \$200 from an out-of-state contributor, yeah, we have to report that. It applies, makes those same reporting procedure requirements apply to campaigns to put a ballot...a question on the ballot.

SENATOR WESELY: What about after it's on the ballot? For instance, on the 402 or I can't remember what that was called on the waste site.

SENATOR WITHEM: After it's on the ballot, the first campaign statement shall be filed not later than 55 days before the deadline for filing petitions with the Secretary of State. Second, campaign statements shall be filed not later than the deadline for filing petitions. Final campaign statements shall be filed not later than 30 days after the deadline for filing. So there is these procedures set up for reports as the process goes on.

SENATOR WESELY: Okay.

SENATOR WITHEM: And if the filing...and if the deadlines...after you look at the deadlines and you think they need to be more reports, fewer reports, at different times, we can sure talk about that.

SENATOR WESELY: Okay, I would like to work with you on that. Thank you. I would support the amendment.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Any other discussion? Seeing none, those in favor of the adoption of the Withem amendment please vote aye, opposed nay. Record.
