With the level of flaws in the structure obviously needs to be repaired if it is to have any continued use at all. Section 9 deals with the appropriation for Games and Parks, Calamus Fish Hatchery. It was indicated the other day the appropriation approved by the Legislature had originally anticipated and provided for \$1 million of donations to be secured. This has not happened, and the change in the appropriation of \$300,000 appropriation from the Game Cash Fund to 1,300,000 of the Game Cash Fund, which is essentially fishing licenses and other revenue they acquire from fishing, and those funds source will make up the amount of money necessary, but the reason for putting it in this bill is that construction can now and is in the process, and if it is approved in the earlier deficit bill, why it will not slow up the construction. In addition, there is also more federal funds available than was originally anticipated, apparent the federal match was indexed and with that indexing provides a higher level of federal funding than what was originally expected. Section 10 is a \$70,000 for an option to lease a transponder satellite. You may recall that in the Governor's budget bill, and there has been other publicity, that the cost that the state currently is paying for distance lines on telecommunications to ETV have risen or will rise significantly, and this is an alternative way of doing it that is being explored, and if we can use...by purchase of this option, there are five spaces left, as I understand it, of these transponders on the satellite. Once those are gone, there will not be, apparently, other commercial type satellites available until sometime after at least 1992 or later, and there will be a cost, should we fully implement the option, of about million, four, as I recall, which would be in the mainline bill, but the cost differential between what we are currently paying for long distance land lines and this would make...would be paid for in about three to four years, as I...four years, so in the long run it pays for itself in fairly short order. And, finally, Section 11, which also has an amendment filed, and as I indicated to you the other day, splits the current appropriation for student scholarships into separate programs. That money has already been disbursed so it has no change on current distribution, but in the event the Legislature chooses to revise the student assistance program in some fashion before the year is over, before the session is over, for next year, this can reduce the maintenance of effort requirement that otherwise would be in effect as far as the federal legislation
