future Governors would choose to do. And it seems to me that it makes a world of sense to have a fully funded state program allocated in a fashion that the state wants to do, rather than use the route that has now developed into the overmatch which the federal government decides the allocation of funds rather than the State of Nebraska deciding how its own funds and only its own funds are to be distributed. So I would urge that the amendment not be adopted. The two programs ought to be set up, even though the distribution would not be different in the funds, but the state had ought to not be burdened with that maintenance of effort if you wish to make a change in the We sught to control our own destiny and not have the federal government doing it.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you, sir. Senator Hannibal. (Gavel.)

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Well, Mr. Speaker, I realize the time is getting very close to a recess. May I inquire of the Chair if we were going to continue after recess with the same issue?

SPEAKER BARRETT: That would be my wish.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Would it be permissible to move we recess until one-thirty.

SPEAKER BARRETT: If the votes are there, it would certainly be in order.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: I would so move.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Anything for the record, Mr. Clerk?

Mr. President, Senator Korshoj has amendments to be printed to LB 588. I have a series of appointment letters from the Governor to be printed. Those will be referred to Reference Committee. (See pages 1550-54 of the Legislative Journal.)
