

down to \$1.6 million, it's a \$1.1 million difference. But I think it's important to remember that this is the same med center that six weeks ago we approved a \$48 million expansion project to. But in the interim now there is another...one of their existing buildings is one of them that is falling down and we have to give them a \$2.8 million appropriation to make up for it. So, yes, it's out of frustration, but it's out of frustration not just in the medical center, but it's out of frustration for some other things at the University of Nebraska. As long as the Legislature continues to simply bail out the problems created by some people at the university and the University of Nebraska Medical Center, and all the problems are because of those people, you're never going to get anywhere. So I think it's important that we reach out and do kick the dog that is biting us in this case, we kick the dog right in the teeth and say a million dollars, a million dollars, this is your problem. And also I think Senator Goodrich is kind of correct, I think it would serve all of us good to read through that Supreme Court case, for all the Legislature to talk to the people from the university, but in the meantime maybe if only between General and Select File, let's take a million dollars out of this budget and make sure it's a darn good conversation, Senator Goodrich, because they have a million dollars at stake. So, with that, I urge the adoption of this amendment.
