SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you, Senator Withem, for that opening. Before proceeding to the first amendment, Senator Withem, I would like to announce that Senator Smith has some guests in the north balcony, 56 sixth graders from St. Michael's in Hastings, Would you people please stand and be with their teacher. recognized. CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Withem had amendments printed on page 1452. Senator, I understand you want to withdraw AM1196.

SENATOR WITHEM: That is correct.

SPEAKER BARRETT: It is withdrawn.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Withem would move to amend. Senator, I have AM1282 before me, found on page 1526 of the Journal.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Withem.
