Senator Wesely, would you like to record your presence, please. Senator Smith, Senator Weihing, Senator Robak, please record your presence. Senator Barrett, Senator Baack, Senator Schmit, Senator Pirsch. Senator Peterson, would you record your presence. We're looking for Senator Pirsch, Senator Chambers, Senator McFarland, Senator Ashford. Now we're looking for Senator Chambers only. Senator Scofield, we're lacking Senator Chambers only. We'll go ahead...you asked for a roll call vote, right? Ladies and gentlemen, the question is...we're going to have a roll call vote, the question is the adoption of the Scofield amendment to the Withem amendment. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote read. See page 1572 of the Legislative Journal.) 15 ayes, 26 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The amendment to the amendment fails. Now we're back on the Withem amendment. The call is raised. Senator Warner, please.
