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is the opportunity to do a study without any Kearney specific references in it, to say that we need a study that looks at higher ed without having a heavy cloud of Kearney hanging over its head. I don't, frankly, think we can do that. Frankly, I think we need a specific reference to Kearney in the study. But what I'm doing is offering you that alternative. If you want to see a study on higher education done, without any reference to Kearney at all, you should vote for the Withem amendment. I don't, so I'm really upset that this no good turkey, Withem, offered the stupid amendment. I'm going to vote against it. But, if those who would like to, and I mentioned to Senator Wesely or Senator Scofield, if you'd like some of the closing time, be happy to offer the rest of the closing time to you to explain why you think this marvelous Senator Withem came up with such a great amendment here.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. The question is the adoption of the Withem amendment.

SENATOR WESELY: Ahhh...

PRESIDENT: Sorry, Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: I do think Senator Withem is marvelous, and this is a marvelous amendment, and I hope everybody will consider seriously voting for it, even if Senator Withem is the only one that opposes his very own amendment. The whole point is not that we don't consider Kearney, that isn't the point. The point is, do we separate it out and make it the focus? I think it's got to be considered in the context of other issues that are much broader, much bigger than just the Kearney issue, it isn't saying don't look at Kearney, don't consider Kearney, it's saying there are many other things that have to be laid on the table, and until you do that you can't truly understand the Kearney issue. I'd like to give the rest of my time to Senator Scofield. And thank you, Senator Withem, for helping us.

PRESIDENT: Senator Scofield, you have a minute and a half.

SENATOR SCOFIELD: Thank you. Thank you, Senator Withem, the marvelous Senator Withem and the marvelous Senator Wesely. I think, Senator Withem, that you may have, in fact, done a better job on an amendment here than you think you have, because I think this...I've listened to the comments made here this morning, specifically Senator Nelson's comments. I think we're
