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most coordinated education across the State of Nebraska. And if I could, I would include all of the community colleges and the rest of the state colleges under the university system to provide those coordinations. The quality of education at Kearney has been brought to question. There are many of those graduates that go directly to the business areas and those...and the Kearney State College is the only place that those businesses will recruit in Nebraska because of the superior quality that those students have achieved in those fields that aren't offered anywhere else in the state. I would urge your support for addition of this amendment and have agreed to yield the balance of my time to Senator Haberman.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Haberman, three minutes.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President and members of the body, a question of Senator Kristensen, please.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Kristensen, would you respond to a question?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Senator Kristensen, from your opening remarks or the second time you spoke, I got the feeling that we're doing this to challenge the Attorney General's Opinion.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: That's not the purpose of the amendment, Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: No, but the purpose of suspending the rules and putting in the amendment is for that purpose?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: That's what creates the urgency to not put this off any longer. Yes.

SENATOR HABERMAN: So the real purpose is to have a court case by the Attorney General's office to see if this can be done, is that correct, due to his opinion?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: That's not the purpose of the amendment. The purpose of the amendment is to put it into the university system. That is a good reason to vote, Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Putting it in the amendment...putting it in
