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were taught by "university professors", the Kearney staff. The other classes in the summer were taught by, two this year were taught by "people that they brought in with their expertise" and I guess one of the things I guess maybe that I think that Kearney is going to lose from this is some of their being able to do that if they have to go through the university system, because I have heard that from other...from some of the university professors and UN-O professors. Once you get part of the university system to offer off-campus courses, the rules become very much more rigid. So with that, I would like to turn the rest of my time over to Senator Korshoj.

SPEAKER BARRETT: One minute. Senator Korshoj.

SENATOR KORSHOJ: Mr. Speaker and members, I will take two seconds and then I will give the balance of the minute to Jacky Smith. I have two questions for the 49 senators, no, 48, because I got my answer. Why does it have to be this year? And why are they so scared of the study and then proceed after we have the study? Jacky Smith, you are up.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Mr. Speaker, I am going to talk really fast. Okay, first of all I want to preface what I am going to say and the questions that I am going to ask with the fact that I am a graduate of Kearney State College, I am going to vote for this measure. After all, I am going to protect my turf just like the other senators in here are going to do, and Kearney is pretty close to me. I know the size of the campus. I have some friends there, so I am not trying to ask these questions to be negative. I am trying to ask them in reference to a concern that Senator Don Wesely brought which is that people are asking questions. And so now I am going to ask these questions that have been asked of me in my district, and in the area, in rural Nebraska, so that we can get a chance, for the record, to see what these folks will say.
