

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President and members, this is an amendment which falls in line with the outline that was distributed. The reason it was not offered to the committee amendments was because it did not fit, it was not appropriate there. It is on page 1592 of the Journal. It changes the date from January 1, 1990, that you can apply for the rebate, back to December 15th. This was to give an opportunity for those people who, for federal income tax purposes, wish to pay their taxes before the end of the year. This would give them a time slot there between December 15th and the end of the year to pay their property taxes. That's the main part of the bill or the amendment. Also adds the wording that the department shall issue a rebate due a taxpayer within 60 days of receipt of a complete application. And also the act shall be considered a complete act and its provisions inseverable. This is rather a technical amendment, does not change the concept of the bill as has been described earlier. I would ask that the amendment be adopted, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Senator Hall, for discussion purposes.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President, if...Senator Lamb, this is the amendment that was printed in the Journal. Okay, all right. Mr. President, I rise in support of Senator Lamb's amendment. I would urge the body to adopt it to the bill.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Any other discussion? Seeing none, Senator Lamb, would you care to make a closing comment?

SENATOR LAMB: I'll waive.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. The question is then the adoption of the Lamb amendment to LB 84. All in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Record, please.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Lamb's amendment.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Conway would move to amend the bill. (Conway amendment is on page 1622 of the Journal.)
