But we're back to the old argument about what's fair and what isn't fair in taxes. definition of taxes is taxes was invented to raise money, raise revenue, not to be fair. And we've lived up to that, we've lived up very, very much to that. We took her from the rich and put her on the poor. We do it over and over and over, we're consistent, they can't say we're not consistent. That is the way we operate. We're going to continue to operate that way. We can vote and vote and vote, and these amendments will be voted down, and we'll charge straight ahead. But this was a tax increase and I am totally shocked that it was two years after we passed it the Governor said, yes, it was a tax increase. was one of the last people in the State of Nebraska to realize it was a tax increase. I don't understand it, but that is fact. Thank you.
