increase in the federal standard exemption. If you want to leave the bill as it was introduced you would vote against the committee amendments, if you want to leave the bill with the child care credit, 25 percent child care credit and the increase to 100 percent of the federal allowable exemption for the elderly, you would vote for the committee amendments. I would urge you to vote for the committee amendments. The issue has been clearly debated on the floor, but I feel that it is not in our best interest to, at this early date, restructure the income tax brackets as they currently exist. But I know full well that there will be further discussion on this issue. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. The question is the adoption of the committee amendments. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Voting on the adoption of the committee amendments. Have you all voted? Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Could I ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Certainly. Shall the house go under call? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 1 may to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The house is under call. Members, please return to your seats and record your presence. Senator Kristensen, Senator Moore, Senator Schimek, record your presence please. Senator Conway. Senators Chambers and Schmit, the house is under call. Senators Chambers and Schmit, the house is under call. Senator Hall, you requested a roll call? Thank you. The question is again the adoption of the committee amendments. Call the roll, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1644 of the Legislative Journal.) 15 ayes, 27 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The committee amendments are not adopted. The call is raised. Mr. Clerk, the next item.

CLERK: Mr. President, some items for the record.
