PRESIDENT: Yes. A roll call vote has been requested and we'll have it in reverse order. Would you please record your presence for now. We're looking for Senator Chambers, Senator Baack, Senator Conway, Senator Goodrich, Senator Moore. Senator Warner, would you please record your presence. Thank you. Senator Pirsch, Senator Schimek. Senator Pirsch and Senator Wesely, Senator Goodrich. Please return to your own seats, and we're still looking for Senator Goodrich and Senator Pirsch. Senator Dierks, do you wish to wait for these two?

SENATOR DIERKS: Who is not here?

PRESIDENT: Senator Pirsch and Senator Goodrich are not here. We can wait. All right, ladies and gentlemen, the question is, shall the Chair be overruled? We're having a roll call vote in reverse order. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 1723-24 of the Legislative Journal.) 18 ayes, 23 nays, Mr. President, on the...

PRESIDENT: The Chair is not overruled. What do you have next on it, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have is by Senators Schmit and Kristensen. Senator, I've got AM1399 in front of me. (Amendment appears on page 1724 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: The call is raised. Senator Schmit, are you handling this?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members, Senator Kristensen did an excellent job of explaining the rebuttable presumption, the statute of repose issue, the previous time that he discussed this issue. He is an attorney, he is experienced with it and I have asked him if he would handle this amendment for us. He has agreed to do so and I will be glad to answer questions also, but at this time I'd like to relinquish my time to Senator Kristensen and have him explain the amendment to the committee amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kristensen, please.
