waste site across the fence from my back door than a sanitary landfill, a packing house, a feedlot, a sanitary landfill or a toxic waste site. And if this amendment is adopted, I intend to offer an amendment to the amended committee amendments that would include toxic wastes, hazardous wastes and infectious wastes along with the low-level waste for the Judiciary Committee to study relative to liabilities. Last week we talked to a great extent about biodegradable products and the things that are going into our landfills. Diapers were mentioned somewhat humorously from time to time in here as a bottom line, but the bottom line is the diapers aren't really the problem about the sanitary landfills. It's the contents of the diapers and the infectious problems that they represent going into our so-called "sanitary" landfills, and I think the study should include these types of things. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Senator Morrissey, followed by Senators Kristensen, Scofield and Lynch.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Question.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Morrissey poses the previous question. Do I see five hands? I do. Those in favor of ceasing debate please vote aye, opposed nay. Record, please.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Debate ceases. Senator Schmit, will you close on the amendment to the amendment?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, I have no closing and I would like to ask Senator Kristensen if he has any other comments. I would just want to say that Kristensen, Abboud, Morrissey are all on the Judiciary Committee and they can certainly keep in close contact with the study and address it and direct it.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you. Thank you, Senator Schmit. In my closing I don't want to diminish how seriously I feel for the need for increased liability in this area. You know, just because I withdrew the amendment for rebuttable presumption doesn't mean I desperately think we need one or the statute of limitations or anything else. That's...the study is not an
