recommended and recognized by even a half a degree in this area, you are taking a step, sobeit, to accommodate some individuals. The accommodation process is there by virtue of their ability to hire Mr. Kaufman if they so choose. If I had thought, Senator Scofield, that it was necessary to place in the law the language, and local monitoring committees shall be members of that community, shall we say the county, shall we say the city closest to the site, shall we say the township, we didn't delineate it to that extent. We thought we could allow it to be left up to the discrimination of the local individuals, but all of a sudden we open it up wide and all of a sudden we say, well, local committee doesn't mean anything, doesn't mean anything. Ladies and gentlemen, if you want to do it the other way, then it is not local committee anymore. If you want a committee, a monitoring committee, made up of experts, you can say so. You can write it into the statute and you have several chances to do that yet as this bill moves or fails to move. But if it is going to be a local monitoring committee, it ought to be a local monitoring committee, and I think that, ladies and gentlemen, that you ought to remember also the other two portions of the bill which I think are somewhat important...of the amendment, which I think are somewhat important, and I would hope that you would adopt this amendment.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. The question is the adoption of the Schmit amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, I would like a call of the house, please.
