that up now. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Elmer would move to amend the Morrissey amendment. (Read Elmer amendment found on page 1735 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Senator Elmer, please.

SENATOR ELMER: Thank you, Mr. President. Thank you, Senator Landis, for your help and, Senator Morrissey, for your acquiescence, and I would merely ask for adoption of this amendment to the amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of the Elmer amendment to the Morrissey amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Elmer's amendment to Senator Morrissey's amendment.

PRESIDENT: The Elmer amendment to the Morrissey amendment is adopted. Now we are back to the Morrissey amendment. Senator Morrissey, there are no other lights on. Would you like to close on the adoption of your amendment as amended?

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Yes, Mr. Speaker and members, I think this is a very just amendment. I think Senator Landis explained it best, that the Governor has been asking time and time again how do we insert some trust into this process? This is one of the ways to insert trust in the process, put some control in the hands of the people and possibly they can become more comfortable with this process. I would move the adoption of my amendment.

PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of the Morrissey amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Excuse me, you wanted a call of the house.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Go ahead and run it.

PRESIDENT: All right. You may go ahead and vote. The question is the adoption of the Morrissey amendment. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 29 ayes, O nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator
