matter is that to quote a number of city and county officials that I have talked to, we really put them in a tough spot on this because we didn't ever bother...

PRESIDENT: One minute.

SENATOR SCOFIELD: ...to decide what is community consent. I think it is our obligation to go ahead and put this mechanism in place. As I said last year, I was willing to consider an option. Nobody has brought me a better option. Voting is the only option that is going to satisfy this and I'm confident that we're going to be able to move ahead in this process. I will give Senator Kristensen my last 20 seconds.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Senator Scofield. Before you vote this morning, I think the best thing to do is put yourself in the position of the local people if you were in one of these counties. And just before you vote, take a real good look at some of these quotes and what do you think you would believe. I'm not talking about being misled. I'm talking about what do you, as a citizen, think was going to happen and what were you led to believe and what you truly do believe. You voted in 402 to stand up to your obligation and remain in the compact and now you need the right that's been promised or at least led to you to believe that you ought to have a chance to vote on whether this facility will be in your backyard. And I ask for your serious consideration for the ultimate right that they need to have for what they have been believed...led to believe is owed to them and that's a right to vote. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Now we haven't quite completed our call of the house. I assume you wanted that, Senator Dierks.

SENATOR DIERKS: Call of the house and a reverse order roll call vote.

PRESIDENT: Yes, okay. The only two I think we're missing are Senator Bernard-Stevens and Senator Haberman. And, Senator Lamb, would you record your presence, please. Thank you. And a roll call vote has been requested in reverse order and that's the way we'll take it. Senator Bernard-Stevens, record your presence, please. Thank you. Now we're looking for Senator Haberman. Is it okay to go ahead without Senator Haberman? They're still looking for him. Okay. The question is the acceptance of the Dierks amendment. All those in favor vote aye
