

and opposed nay and we'll have a roll call vote in reverse order. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote read. See pages 1747-48 of the Legislative Journal.) 22 ayes, 24 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The amendment fails. The call is raised. Do you have something else on it, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Chambers would move to amend the bill. (The Chambers amendment appears on page 1748 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers, please.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, a copy of the amendment is being passed around to you now but I can tell you what it does. Yesterday an amendment was adopted that Senator Schmit offered which would say that the representatives on this monitoring committee must be residents of Nebraska. The amendment I am proposing would be attached to that amendment which was adopted. So on page 6 at line 19, after the word "Nebraska" in Senator Schmit's amendment would be added these words, "except that a municipality may select one member who is not a resident of Nebraska." I found it ironic that Senator Schmit offered the amendment that would deny a municipality the opportunity to select an individual of their choice to see that their interests were represented. I would like to ask Senator Kristensen a question if I may.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kristensen, would you respond, please.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Kristensen, this is for the purpose of getting correctly into the record what happened yesterday. Were you asked by Senator Schmit to explain some matters relative to a statute of limitations, a statute of repose and other related issues because you had the expertise and knowledge for offering that explanation?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Yes, I spoke on those issues.
