SENATOR SMITH: Mr. Chairman, I would wonder if we had enough discussion on both sides of this issue on the amendment. I don't think we did.

PRESIDENT: Yeah, well...

SENATOR SMITH: See, I wanted a chance to talk on the other side.

PRESIDENT: Yeah, well, we're past that, I'm sorry. Senator Morrissey, will you accept call ins on ceasing debate?

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Yes.

PRESIDENT: All right. The question is, shall debate cease, if you wish to call in.

CLERK: Senator Barrett voting yes. Senator Hartnett voting yes. Senator Rogers voting...you are voting yes. Senator Coordsen voting yes. Senator Lindsay voting yes. Senator Peterson voting yes.
