

Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Debate has ceased. Senator Bernard-Stevens, would you like to close on your motion.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: I think the Chamber is well aware, the body is well aware of the amendment that is pending. I would hope that the body would, in its infinite wisdom, vote to reconsider and then we can move onward. Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. The question is, shall the Chambers amendment be reconsidered? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: I was hoping not to have to do it, but with 11 people not voting and not here, obviously we'll have to have a call of the house. We'll go with a roll call vote in regular order.

PRESIDENT: Okay, question is, shall the house...You called for a call of the house, did you not?

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Correct.

PRESIDENT: The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, to go under call.

PRESIDENT: The house is under call. Will you please record your presence. Those not in the Chamber please return to the Chamber and record your presence. Unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Please record your presence. Senator Pirsch, Senator Moore, would you record your presence, please. Thank you. Senator Abboud and Senator Pirsch. Now we're looking for Senator Abboud only. Okay, and you asked for a roll call vote in reverse order. Regular order. The question is the reconsideration of Senator Chambers' motion, and roll call vote in regular order. Mr. Clerk, we're all here.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1759 of the Legislative Journal.) 24 ayes, 23 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to reconsider.
