

SENATOR WITHEM: I have decided that I will not pursue the kill motion. I would like to withdraw that.

SPEAKER BARRETT: It is withdrawn.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first amendment I have to the bill is by Senator Lynch. Senator, I have AM1161 in front of me. It's on page 1448 of the Journal.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Lynch.

SENATOR LYNCH: Yes, Mr. President and members of the Legislature, this is a clean-up amendment only. It has three sections. The first one clarifies that a teacher with a Master's degree is only counted once in the Phase II weighted formula. The second provision simply cleans up the confusing language regarding the Department of Education, providing to the State Treasurer the dollar amounts each education provider will receive of Phase II monies, and the third deletes a sentence that's no longer necessary. It says the department will not distribute any Phase II monies to a provider until it has an agreement with the teachers on how to distribute the additional money with Senator Scott Moore's General File amendment which provided that the districts and the teachers will bargain on the distribution of '89 Phase II monies, at the same time, and ask the bargaining for other salaries. This sentence is no longer necessary. Any disputes, by the way, between the administrators and the teachers will go through the CIR as is the current procedure for solving disputes. That, basically, is that amendment. I would move for its adoption.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Is there discussion on the amendment offered by Senator Lynch? Seeing none, those in favor of its adoption vote aye, opposed nay. Please record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Lynch's amendment.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The amendment is adopted. Mr. President, Senator Moore would move to amend. Senator, this is your amendment on page 1449 of the Journal.
