

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Lynch, followed by Senator Withem.

SENATOR LYNCH: Question.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? Correction, we just have an amendment to the Lamb amendment which has just arrived. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Goodrich would move to amend Senator Lamb's amendment. (The Goodrich amendment appears on page 1780 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Goodrich, please.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Mr. President and members of the body, would Senator Lamb respond to a question or two?

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Yes, sir.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Okay, Senator Lamb, you're adding \$20 million...you're putting \$20 million in general distribution with the current foundation and equalization formula...

SENATOR LAMB: Yes.

SENATOR GOODRICH: ...but you're striking out the other sections of the bill?

SENATOR LAMB: Yes, that's correct.

SENATOR GOODRICH: My amendment right here would do this. It would strike the first three lines of your amendment which says, in essence, all we're doing is we're not striking out the 20 million special appropriation for the way the Conway amendment distributes it but we would be adding a \$20 million extra to the state aid bill, 89, so that you would have 20 million in this bill for your equalization foundation distribution and we would also have the Conway 20 million for the regular teachers' salaries amendment. What was your reaction?

SENATOR LAMB: Negative.
