CLERK: 18 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

Senators Conway, Chambers, Weihing, Ashford, please check in. Senator Chambers. Senator Wesely, the house is under call. Senator Lamb, you are ready to proceed with a roll call vote on your amendment? Thank you. Mr. Clerk, on the adoption of the Lamb amendment.
