CLERK: Senator, I'm sorry, that's an amendment to the Conway amendment.

PRESIDENT: Okay.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Lamb would move to amend. (The Lamb amendment appears on page 1732 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Senator Lamb, please.

SENATOR LAMB: Thank you, Mr. President, and members, this is really a technical amendment and this is AM1435 (sic). It's printed. Could you tell me the page, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Page 1732, Senator.

SENATOR LAMB: Okay.

CLERK: AM1386.

SENATOR LAMB: AM1386. This is an amendment which clarifies the forms that will be...who provides the forms that will be used to get the rebate under the terms of the bill. The counties will provide the homestead exemption forms and that's currently in the bill but it's fuzzy as to who would supply the forms for those who apply for the 10 percent rebate. This states that the Department of Revenue will assume that job, to provide the forms for the rebates. That's all it does. There is a slight increase in the...in the A bill and there will be an amendment on the A bill to reflect an error and then to reflect this \$84,000 cost for the Department of Revenue to provide these forms. I would ask that the amendment be adopted.

PRESIDENT: Senator Landis, please. Oh, Senator Chambers, then, please.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I only have one comment at this point. Senator Lamb, you said these various agencies would be responsible for supplying the forms or providing them? All right, these various agencies may provide them but, based on the conglomerate of this bill, Barnam and Bailey ought to design them.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lamb, would you like to close on your amendment, please. The question is the adoption of the Lamb
