

paid to the Leo Daly company and that, together, would be somewhere in the neighborhood of, say, half of it's spent, there would be another total there of \$400,000 balance that could be used for the purposes of this determination or this study with regard to the structural defects of the building. Senator Withem might want to answer that as well.

SENATOR WITHEM: Yes, Senator Korshoj, the figure, \$100,000, originally we had...when we originally drafted this had the number \$50,000 in it. The number, \$100,000, is used because, you know, the little background information I did to ask about load testing, how much is cost...in load testing a load test could be done for considerably less than this \$100,000. From people that are in the...the indication from people that my staff visited with that are in the testing business have indicated that they think the load test itself could be done for considerably less than 100,000. If you want to get into some more...some more sort of testing, it may cost more.

SENATOR KORSHOJ: Yes, but we're not talking it escalating to where we will spend half what the total expenditure would be if we went ahead and fixed it. You're just anticipating that.

SENATOR WITHEM: My rationalization for putting the \$100,000 in there, to say that's the money that's available. I'm welcome for other people to come forward and prove to me that it will cost more than that, but that's...

SENATOR KORSHOJ: But you're relatively comfortable.

SENATOR WITHEM: I'm relatively comfortable.

SENATOR KORSHOJ: Yeah, thank you. I was to that meeting down on main floor here that night and they showed us photos and what they talked about. There are telltale signs that there's something wrong with the structure but I'm not sure it's the structure itself. It could be some very shoddish workmanship also and I think we've got to determine that. And I don't know why it would be so bad to delay it another eight or nine months if there is a chance that this here study could prove that maybe it's just the workmanship and not the structure. Who knows? I really don't know. I was going to ask a couple questions on the workmanship that night down at the meeting and every time he looked at me to ask a question I got intercepted by Senator Lynch and he asked his questions so I never did get to go into
