

but the statute of limitations had run there as well. I think it's important that we adopt this amendment. It does not hurt the integrity of the bill. It allows for the funds to be appropriated. It says, first and foremost we need to know to what extent the damage is contained there and we do that through an independent study that we authorize, that we control. I would urge the adoption of the amendment to LB 812.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. The question is the adoption of the Hall amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Senator Hall.

Senator Landis, will you record your presence, please. Thank you. Only Senator Hefner, please, and Senator McFarland is just walking in. All right. And the question is the adoption of the Hall amendment and a roll call vote, please. Mr. Clerk.
