SENATOR LANDIS: ... as we look up there and both parties think that if everybody goes their way, there will be no votes.

PRESIDENT: The question is, shall the house go under cali?

SENATOR LANDIS: No, no, no, no, no, you don't understand me. What I'm saying is, I just hope the nonvoters don't make all those stay because they don't vote.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Record vote, please.

PRESIDENT: Record vote. All right, have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk, record vote.

(Record vote read. See page 1927 of the Legislative Journal.) 21 ayes, 21 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to reconsider.

PRESIDENT: The motion fails. Do you have anything else on the bill, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Nothing at this time, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Okay, we're back on the advancement of the bill. Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Am I closing, Mr. President?

PRESIDENT: No, I have two other lights on.

SENATOR LAMB: I will pass.

PRESIDENT: Okay, Senator Rod Johnson. Senator Wesely. Senator Lynch. Okay, it won't be necessary. Senator Lamb, would you like to close? Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: I think I had my light on.

PRESIDENT: Your light came on after. Okay, did you wish to speak?
