SENATOR LAMB: I will pass.

PRESIDENT: Okay, Senator Rod Johnson. Senator Wesely. Senator Lynch. Okay, it won't be necessary. Senator Lamb, would you like to close? Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: I think I had my light on.

PRESIDENT: Your light came on after. Okay, did you wish to speak?
